Why the effort?

- ► Want to do research and/or pay for rent?
- Capability to attract funds requirement for most jobs nowadays
- Successful applications are a signal to future funders!
- ► Funding organisations are often attractive employer
- Assuming here that you wanna pursue an academic career ... but even if you do not, finding somebody to invest into you is key everywhere

What to fund?

- ► Yourself
- ► Your research
 - ► small grants, career grants
 - ► travel, staff, subject payments
- ► Your teaching
- ► Infrastructure

Where to find funding for your studies

- ► ESRC
- ► Commercial and charitable organizations
- ► Governments and government-like organizations (e.g., political parties)
- ► Academic institutions
- Businesses
- ► Crowd-sourcing

Where to find research funding I

- ► ESRC
- ► Commercial and charitable organizations
- ► Governments and government-like organizations (e.g., political parties)
- ► Academic institutions Essex Research & and Enterprise Office
- Businesses
- Crowd-sourcing

Where to find research funding II

- ► Governmental research organisations:
 - ► NSF, DAAD, ANR, SNSF
 - ► Any other rich country
 - ▶ Often you need some connection to the country of origin
- ► Professional organizations
 - ► PSA, APSA, etc. sign up for newsletters
- ► Europe: ERC, EU framework programs

Specific funding organizations

- ► ESRC: large grants; career grants; except studentships, probably interesting once you found a job
- British Academy: Small grants from post-docs to older; career grants
- ► Leverhulme trust: small grants from post-docs to older; career grants

How to get it

- ► Search for them!
- ▶ Apply, apply, apply
- ▶ Be the minion on a grant, then be a co-PI
- ► Look for what is special about you! Your nationality? Other social characteristics?
- ► Recycle work you have already done
- ► Identify colleagues who got funding funding is offered by a small set of people
- ▶ Do it again, immediately after you got rejected
